White-plumed and Brown-headed Honeyeaters, White-winged Chough, Little and Rainbow Lorikeets, Superb Fairy-wren and Grey Fantail. Wetland species, Grey and Chestnut teal, Wood Duck, Pacific Black and Australasian Grebe.
